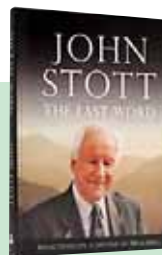

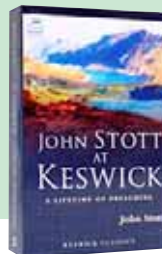

Growing fellowships of Bible preachers

We all agree that a church is more than its services, a family more than its meal times. And since it began six years ago, Langham Preaching has sought to encourage 'fellowships' rather than just run events. In several countries there is gradually emerging a fellowship of preachers – a 'movement' for Biblical preaching. Supported by seminars, books and training resources, such a movement is most clearly seen through the emergence of preachers' clubs in towns and villages. Meeting regularly in their home region, small groups of pastors and lay preachers gather to study a Bible passage, work on sermon preparation, and plan their preaching series. And of course they pray for one another and support each other's desire to preach better. Linked to regional or national seminar programmes which provide training materials and good models for Biblical preaching, preachers' clubs are the heartbeat of national preaching movements.

They are growing across Kenya, encouraged to meet regularly by country coordinator **Mercy Ireri** who uses her cell phone to good effect as she chases up local leaders for news of their club meetings, or encourages them forward with new ideas. Pastors often

contact Langham Preaching via our web site, and we can quickly forward names to Mercy who soon plugs them into the network of preachers' clubs gradually extending across the country. 'A few months ago you forwarded to me an email from pastor Jonathan in Nakuru. I put him in touch with the leader of the preachers' club, Asman, there in the Rift Valley. Asman told me that they had a good meeting and are planning to work together. At the time I put them in touch it was during the violence – it did not even cross my mind that Jonathan is a Kalenjin and Asman is Kikuyu. Asman told me that it was a miracle for both of them to sit together and even have a cup of tea!'

For the past three years a small core of 40 pastors have been attending the Langham training programme in the **Democratic Republic of Congo**, and developing preachers' clubs in their home regions. And now? 'We have actually 28 clubs in the country with 298 members', says country coordinator **Muhindo Isesomo**, who travels widely to encourage them. 'And I believe this will increase after the next Langham training of trainers event in October'. Through the generosity of friends at St Andrew's church Oxford we have recently been able to support their work through the provision of bikes and Bibles, (see photo) enabling the pastors to travel to their many scattered congregations and to meet to study scripture together.

Chairman's Word

The LPI Council met in Farnham, U.K. in late September.

One of the speakers was Dr Parush Parushev, Principal of the International Baptist Theological Seminary in Prague. He was supported by two Langham scholars. Each speaker identified the challenges faced by evangelical Christians in Eastern Europe, including their for good quality Christian books written by local Christians, in local languages. The importance of providing opportunities for future Christian leaders to study at PhD level, and to secure recognition as scholars, was also emphasised.

The LPI grass roots preaching programs, in the same region, were the subject of a further report. Without those teaching opportunities many pastors would struggle to accurately teach God's word to their people.

Please remember our brothers and sisters who seek to live faithful Christian lives in Eastern Europe, and across the majority world, without access to the literature, educational opportunities and sound teaching that we take for granted. Please remember this need in your prayers and again consider your financial support for the work of LPI, as it seeks to provide training, opportunities and resources to meet the needs of our brothers and sisters in the faith.

In **Tanzania**, small clubs have been established across the country, forming the base for 13 regional programmes which are now starting small training events for local pastors. And in **Bolivia** and **Columbia**, and other Latin countries, preachers' clubs are vital training arenas – so much so they are called 'escuelitas', little schools for preachers.



For any movement to catch fire, local people must own it, and passionate and committed people in the country must drive it forward. We don't know if this will happen in each country, but this is what we pray for – national preaching movements which seek to unite, encourage, equip, train and inspire all those who are faithfully teaching and preaching God's Word.

Here in our Pacific Region Langham Preaching continues to have an impact. In Vanuatu just last week we heard of five preaching clubs meeting on the island of Pentecost as the result of one man's attendance at level 1 training in March of this year. With level 2 planned for March 09 in Vanuatu and level 1 in both the Solomon Islands (June 09) and Papua New Guinea (November 09) we look to our LPA friends and partners to support these exciting opportunities here on our doorstep in both prayer and giving.

Langham Australia visits Egypt

Wendy Toulmin, Executive Officer LPA, had the great privilege recently of spending time with the remarkable team of men and women, training and being trained, at the Evangelical Theological Seminary of Cairo. During her visit she asked Dr Atef Gendy, Principal of the College, about the Church in Egypt.



"I believe the Egyptian Church is in a unique situation though not an easy one. Despite all the problems it encounters

- in being a minority church
- in existing in probably the most violent part of the world
- in being amongst a majority of Muslims (especially if you remember that whereas Mecca in Saudi Arabia is considered the 'heart' of Islam, **Egypt is called the 'mind' of Islam**



because of the Al-Azhar University, which is the main university responsible for graduating and equipping Islamic leaders for the whole world) ... despite all this, we are in a unique situation, as **we are blessed with many important opportunities.**

Egypt experiences a great degree of religious freedom compared to neighbouring countries such as the Gulf States or Northern Africa countries. There is, at least, the recognition of **a church that has been functioning since the first century.**

This recognition allows the minority Egyptian church to worship over the ground and to practice its mission and testimony to the whole region. This puts a responsibility on us for which we need Christians who are willing to get rid of their fear and the 'minority complex', the sense of being inferior, or weak or vulnerable. We need to remember more and more that we carry a message that the majority lacks and we have something that the whole world needs. Accordingly we don't have to look down on ourselves.



This is what we feel to be our responsibility as leaders of the church to equip leaders who not only have zeal for the message they carry but they have trust, pride, and a conviction that they have all the riches of the



Gospel which the whole world needs and this particular part of the world needs much more than others.'

WT: 'And how can Langham support you in this task?'

'Your support of us is to continue your prayer and what you are doing as the Langham Partnership –

- Supporting and equipping leaders for the church in the majority world like what you did with me and other scholars in my region. This reflects a wonderful message that God has witnesses everywhere in the world not just in the west or the north.
- By continuing your support to our libraries by good theological literature, and encouraging nationals theologians to write in their own languages, reflecting on their own situations instead of depending totally on translations that might be suitable to certain contexts.
- Expanding your expository preaching to equip the new believers so the Church will not spread too thin since there is a curtail need for the church to mature and go deeper in its relationship with God.



I hope to see these three areas working together in harmony. I also hope to see scholarships offered to prepare world class scholars in preaching so that in the near future we may have expository preaching taught appropriately as a main subject in most of our seminaries and bible colleges.'

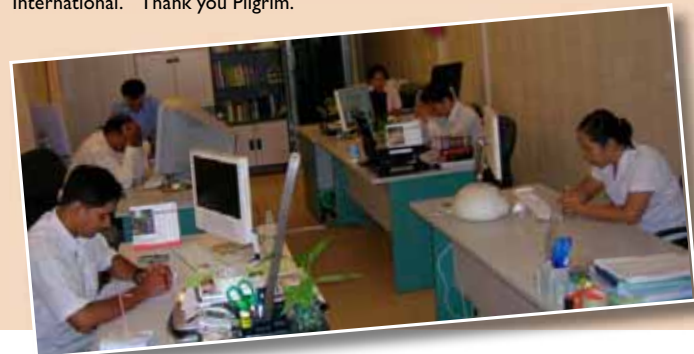
